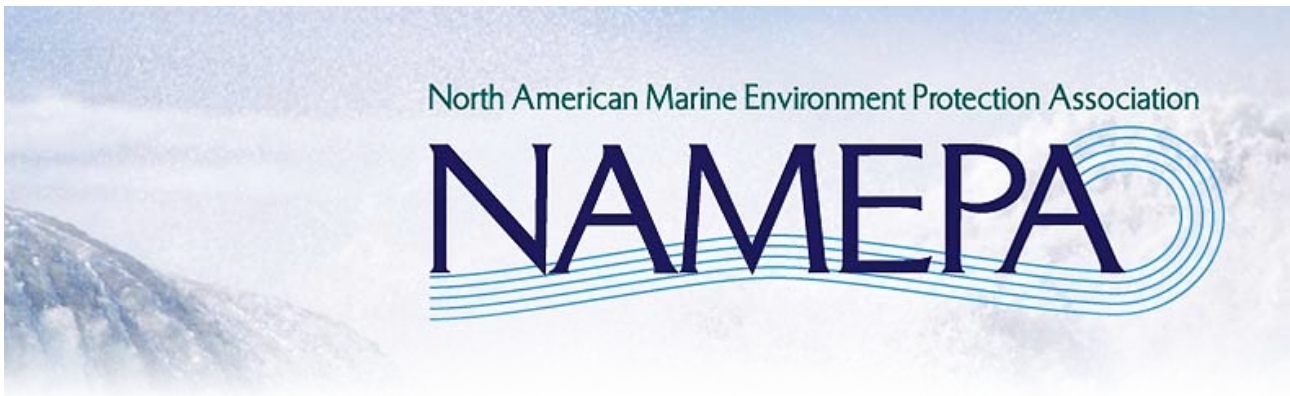


MARINE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION AWARD
